

Trip dates: July 24-31 2021

Location

900 Blue Heron Blvd. Riviera Beach, FL 33404

There is no cost to enter the park, and parking is free.



Details

This is a beach entry, very easy. No waves, no drop offs. You can dive the east bridge or the west bridge. The critters are quite different on both dives. There are also artificial reefs set up like a trail to the south.

The deepest depth is about 24 ft. and at this depth you can do a 1.5 to 2 hour dive. The current will chase you out.

Visibility can be 4 ft to 20 ft depending on the day.

Water temperature should be quite nice, although I always use a wet skin or wet suit for protection.

This is a great place for new divers, checking out gear, fun dives, and photographers. In fact, if you have the book Reef Fish Identification by Humann and Deloach many of the pictures are from this site.

Dangers

Water clarity

Stay within the buoys, going out to far could get you in the boating lane.

For first timers, stay close to bridges and follow reefs on the south side. Even with a compass the tide current can take you. You can always surface to check where you are.

There are a lot of Scorpion Fish, Sting Rays, Sea Urchins & occasional Jellyfish, so be careful where you touch.
