Naboo Resort is a small new resort located walking distance to the beach. They have two dive boats that pick you up at the beach. Completely Valet diving. They will load all your gear, change tanks and clean and store gear after the dive. The resort has very comfortable rooms (18), so don't wait too long to grab one.

Naboo is where Tony & I dive. We carefully selected them because they were the best in our opinion. The staff is friendly, very experienced and helpful. It doesn't hurt that it is a new resort and everything is new. There is a hot water shower, and lockers if you need one. Also, a nice big bathroom right there. After the dive we shower & walk over to the restaurant and order lunch; the food is delicious. We take a dip in the pool and then lay out to dry off a bit. A very relaxing day! It is a small resort so everything is nice and close and quiet. If you want to party there a several large resorts within walking distance.

The boats were designed for diving and it is very easy to get out of the water with your gear on. Definitely the easiest we have experienced. You do a backward entry into the water. When you get back into the boat, the captain, (Luther), is there to help you out of the water. There are never more than 6 people with a dive master (Elise or Andreas) and with the smaller groups they can show you plenty of sea life. Because of the resort's location, we often dive the south side of the island, which is great.

We chose this time of year because we really enjoyed it. It's not crazy busy and the weather was lovely. We saw pilot whales, dolphins, and even a whale shark. The whale shark sighting is not normal but sightings had been reported for a couple of weeks. The water is clear and a comfortable temperature of (81 degrees), so wet suits are optional; wet skins will do.

You will be ordering your meal off the menu and the food is great.

I also left a day open, Sept 7^{th,} which is the last full day there to do an optional full day island tour. We have already booked Cleve, of Cleve's Island Tours, who is the number one rated guide on the island (trip advisor). He will explain the islands history and culture. Just fascinating and his enthusiasm is contagious. Everyone loves it and it will be a memorable highlight of your stay. There is an additional charge for this. Usually, \$65 PP and you will be gone all day. It will give your gear a chance to dry out really well before your return home.

If you desire to stay longer, just let the resort know when making your reservation and I'm certain they will try to accommodate you.
