Do YOU Need a BUDDY??



YES!!!!!!!!!!

Never Solo Dive unless you have:

- Extra Appropriate Training.
- Equipment.



Just Got an "Insta-Buddy?"



Paired Up with a New Buddy? - 5 Questions to Ask--

- How Much Do You Dive?
 - (Frequency, Number, Cert Level, Etc)
- Where Have You Been Diving?
 - (Shallow, Hot/Cold Water, Wreck, Drift, Etc)
- What Are You Looking For On This Dive?
 - (Goals, Fishlife Interests, Photog (Macro/Micro?)
- What Do You Expect From Your Buddy?
 - (Signals, Speed, Positioning, Etc)
- Anything I need to Know About You, Your Condition, or Your Gear?

(Equalization Issues, Tend to Cramp?, Dive Depth Limits, NITROX, Tank Size, Air Consumption, Pony/Spare Air, Etc)



Key Buddy Factors



Situational Awareness

Communication

Trust



Other Considerations



- Differences in Experience Level
 (Respect the Differences Assist Without Frustrating)
- Compatibility of Skills / Conditioning.
 (Pace, Endurance, Consumption, Complexity)
- Decision to Surface Separately??
 (School Solution is NO! However unfortunately people do this.....)
- Just Say NO!!
 (Stay within Your Capabilities / Comfort
 Level Don't Allow Pride / Pressure to Push Limits)
- Bring Something to the Table.
 (Current on First Aid, AED Qual / Oxygen Qual Know Dangerous Fish / Corals and how to Treat)



How Close is Close Enough?



- Diving in the Same Ocean is NOT Close Enough!!
- Book Says.... Within Two Fin Kicks!!

Depends On:

- Experience Level
- Comfort Level
- Diving with a Group or Alone
- Diving Conditions (Current / Viz,)
- Any Health Issues



Photographers as Buddies?



Considerations:

- Two Photographers May, or May Not, be the best Buddy Team.
- May not maintain close proximity.
- Requires patience for one or both divers.
- Hope both Photogs have similar preferences.
- Good mix can be a Non-Photog and a Photographer.



How to Find a Buddy



Just Got Certified?, OR New to Area?

- If your Significant Other, or Friend just Got Certified Too.
 (Don't Go Alone!)
- Join a Club.. And Attend Meetings
- Go on Club Trips Local and Distant.
- Frequent Diver Haunts Shops /Sites.
- Go on Monthly Spring Dives.
- Take Additional Training, If Appropriate.



Lost Buddy??



Probably One of the Most Ignored Recommendations in Scuba.....

- 1. Look for ONE Minute- During That Minute, Look For Bubbles.
- 2. Go To The Surface... Careful of Passing Boats.
- 1. Rejoin on Surface.
- 2. Continue Dive.

If a Threesome – Don't Split Up to Search!



A True Buddy



- Gets Familiar with Your Equipment.
- Compares Dive Goals
- Stays with You at the Surface.
- Stays Close During the Dive.
- Periodically Asks if you are OK.
- Compares Air/Gas Levels with You.

- Ascends with You.
- Does 3- Minute Stop With You.
- Stays With You at the Surface.
- Asks How You Are Once Out of the Water.
- Someone You Trust!
