




Diving Florida for New, Returning, and Experienced Divers





 So, you just got Scuba Certified, Scuba "Refreshed" or you are a New Diver to Florida-NOW WHAT??

Two Goals:

- Discuss Florida Diving Opportunities to work on Skills / Experience progression.
- Provide an orientation to Experienced Divers on Diving Opportunities in Florida.

New/Returning Diver Considerations

- Identifying Dive Opportunities that allow you to develop your skills and/or enhance your comfort level:
 - Work on Buoyancy.
 - Get comfortable with equipment.
 - Tweak your equipment.
 - Work on Navigation.
 - Work on more advanced qualifications/ certifications.
 - Build up your dive numbers and overall experience.
 - Recommendation: Hold off on Photography until you have gotten very "Comfortable" in the water and have good Buoyancy.
 - Potentially 30-40 dives after Cert or 20-25 after Refresh.
 - Dive at your personal "Comfort Level".



Factors in Reviewing Florida Dive Opportunities



- Ranking Areas in terms of Difficulty.
 - Novice (N)
 - Intermediate (I)
 - Advanced (A)
- Cost. Where available, we'll provide a ROM cost for diving in those areas.

- Underlined Springs are very benign areas to work on skills
- Many Springs are Cavern/Cave environment.

Beach Diving





Considerations:

- Blue Heron is a Tidal Dive,
 Should dive at HIGH Tide +/- 1
 hour. Very Shallow up to 18 20 ft
- Venice area is a very good area for Shark and Megladon Tooth diving
- Ensure that you are physically strong enough to get thru the surf!!!





Boat Diving Considerations



- Equipment Organization (Wet Bag / Dry Bag)
- Safety Equipment
- Entry
- Descent / Ascent Procedures
- Safety Stop Assistance Measures (Anchor Line -Bars –Tanks?)
- Navigation
- Signaling
- Current / Wave Action
- Re-Boarding (Fins/No Fins/Other Considerations?)




